Investing in tech to beat BDS

JON Medved (pictured), CEO of one of the world's biggest crowdfunding equity platforms OurCrowd, is imploring the Jewish community to



support Israel through investing in its technology companies.

Medved, one of Israel's most respected technology investors who is visiting Australia this week, told *The AJN* this is another way to bolster support for Israel, tackle the boycott, divestment and sanctions (BDS) campaign and strengthen the country.

"Just like through the years we've always built Israel by investing in its trees, in Israel bonds and in the UIA, which is critically important that we continue doing, but now we have to add a new dimension to our support for Israel, which is to get involved in this incredible innovation story," Medved said.

Hailing Israel's technology sector, Medved added, "We innovate, therefore we are. In Israel, we innovate or die, that's the bottom line. It's been that way since the beginning and that's why we are this start-up nation."

Through this mentality and through investing in Australia's burgeoning tech sector, his company is breaking down barriers and tackling BDS.

"The more we connect these two countries the more we show that people can both create money, create jobs and benefit humanity and solve big problems. Go boycott that! Boycott the fact that an Israeli platform is helping an Australian company get into the market and raise over a million dollars in investment for Australia," Medved explained.

Medved attributes Israel's success to a culture that celebrates risk and doesn't live in fear of failure, urging Australians to follow suit. "It starts with the entrepreneurs who need to ... understand that the worst thing that can happen to them is to fail. Big deal! Get over it! It's part of the game."

OurCrowd has been at the forefront of innovations emanating from

Israel, including ReWalk, the robotic exoskeleton that allows paraplegic people to walk, which he described as Israel's most inspiring invention.

"The reason why I'm so proud of that company is it is an investment that benefits profit, people and the planet," Medved said.

Medved added that he is delighted to be presenting at the Creative Innovation conference in Melbourne, spearheaded by Tania de Jong.
