Ten emerging leaders and innovators across Australia have been selected as scholarship winners from an enormous pool of talented applicants. They will attend Creative Innovation 2011 and present their innovation for the future to some of the biggest business thinkers in the world including legendary Dr. Edward de Bono, Daniel Dennett, Stephen Heppell and one of the USA's top ten entrepreneurs and inventors Raymond Kurzweil.

Winners will also be able to rub shoulders with over 35 leading innovators and leaders and delegates from an enormous range of industries, government and business.

Creative Innovation 2011 has announced 10 Innovation Leaders who will receive scholarships to this year's inaugural event featuring world-leading thinkers such as Edward de Bono, Raymond Kurzweil and Daniel Dennett.

THE 10 winners of the Innovation Leader Scholarships for CI 2010 are:

Chantelle Baxter is the co-founder of One Girl, an organisation that alters the lives of women in girls in Sierra Leone through education and sanitary pads. That's right, sanitary pads. Who knew a sanitary pad could change the world?

Marita Cheng is the Founder and Executive Director of Robogals, which aims to get more girls interested in science, engineering and technology. Founded in 2008, Robogals has run robotics workshops for 3000 girls and has 17 chapters in 6 countries. With the entrepreneurship skills she has gained from that, Marita is currently starting up her own robotics company.

Justin Boddey is a biomedical research scientist studying Malaria at the Walter and Eliza Hall Institute of Medical Research in Melbourne. He hopes to determine how the most lethal malaria parasite uses the liver as a safe-haven to develop in humans before infecting red blood cells, as the liver-stage of malaria holds real promise for the development of a future antimalarial vaccine

Walter Villagonzalo is the The Founder of The Migrant HUB based in Werribee. Australia continues to receive thousands of skilled migrants to satisfy the growing needs of industry while wasting many of the skills of migrants already here. Under Walter's leadership The Migrant Hub is addressing the issue through the establishment of social enterprises to tap this resource of skills, create opportunities for local work

He is part of a team establishing Quantum Victoria; a Centre of Excellence and Innovation which aims to re-energize science and mathematics education across Australia and beyond.

Trained as a landscape architect, **Lucinda Hartley** is a designer, social entrepreneur and founder of Codesign studio. CoDesign is a multi-disciplinary, non-profit professional design services organisation dedicated to working with disadvantaged communities to co-create solutions for built environment projects.

Now, as the Director of Spark*, he is working to change the way Australians engage with extreme poverty, while enabling a new generation of local changemakers in some of the poorest places on the planet.
